## **The Bottom Line**

In the Prairies, it is a legal responsibility to report any suspected child abuse and/or neglect. Listed below is contact information for reporting in the Prairies. For convenience and immediacy, you may also report to your local police/RCMP. In an emergency situation, call 911.

## **Regulations on Reporting Child Abuse in The Prairies**

In Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba, it is your legal responsibility to report witnessed suspected child (under 18 years of age) abuse or neglect, even if you believe a report has already been filed.

Once reported, a trained professional will follow up with the child and family and determine whether or not the child is at risk and in need of further protection.

The person reporting the suspected abuse is not required to provide their name. They may be contacted at a later date to give more detailed information regarding the allegations, but the interaction can remain anonymous.

Reports can be made to your nearest Child Protection office (which vary by location of regions), First Nations Child and Family Services Agency or local police/RCMP.

If you believe the child is in immediate danger, please contact your local police/RCMP directly or call 911.
